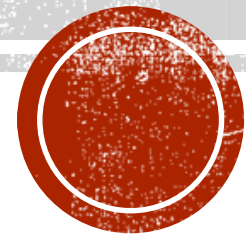

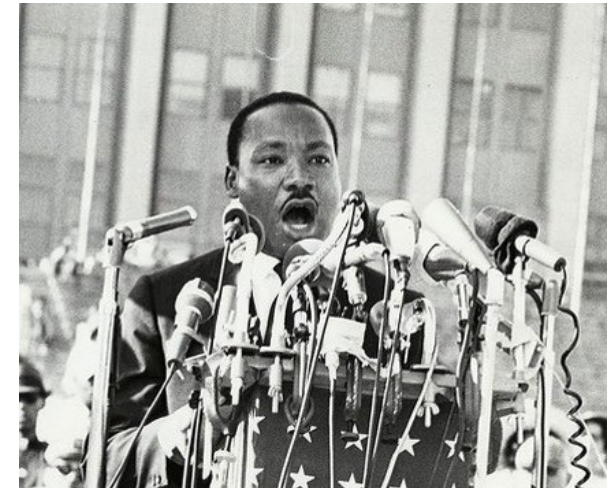

- Everyone should treat others the way they want to be treated. **[Golden Rule]**





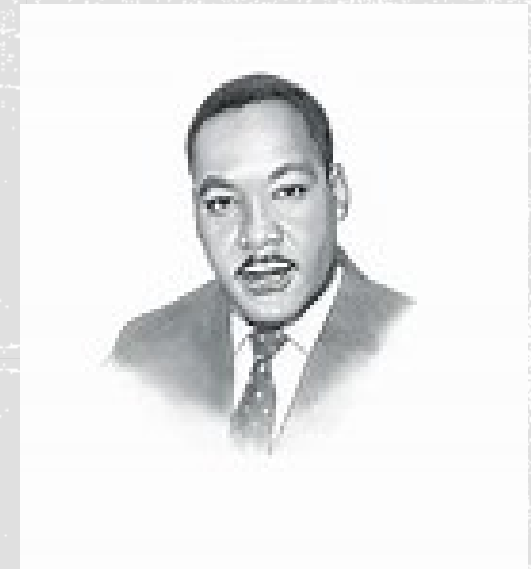
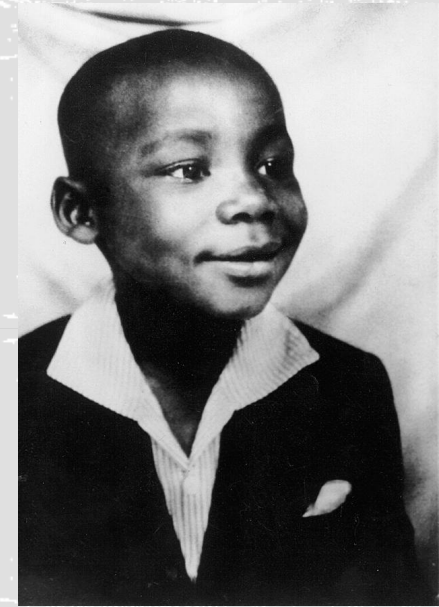
"I HAVE A DREAM"

- "I Have A Dream" speech was held on August 28, 1963
- The speech was held on the Lincoln Memorial.
- "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character" - Martin Luther King, Jr.



MARTIN'S LIFE

- Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929.
- When Martin was born his name was Michael. When he was about six-years-old, his parents changed his name to Martin.
- Martin gave very important speeches like "I Have a Dream" and "Injustice Anywhere is a Threat to Justice Everywhere."
- Martin went to jail several times for being brave and standing up for others and himself.
- The brave King sadly died on April 4, 1968.
