
Discovering who you are meant to be.

As a follow-up to the district closure information sent to you last week, here are several important points. If the district, a school or even a classroom should close due to COVID-19 the following will occur:

- You will receive general building information from Mr. Carmichael.
- Your child's classroom teacher will then communicate a more detailed schedule.
- On the first day of the closure your child will be assigned tasks and activities via Seesaw.
 No Zoom sessions will occur on the first day.
- On the second day of closure, your child will begin zooming, with staff, throughout the day following their daily schedule. The daily schedule, for everyone, begins at 8:30 AM.
- Students will receive instruction in all academic subjects daily.
- Students will receive instruction in a "special" class daily.
- The length of each period will be modified.
- Students who receive support services and extra curriculars will continue to receive these services.
